Dastkar Exhibition, New Delhi

In 2016, READ India explored the option of working on the concept of Farm to Finish and initiated the work with the guidance of experts like Sonal Baid, who travelled to the remote READ Knowledge Centres and interacted with the rural women. She encouraged the women and READ India team to initiate the process.

Organic cotton was procured from the farmers and also from Wardha, looms were set up with the guidance of experts and the initiative was turned into action. It took time to motivate, encourage and learn the weaving and natural dyeing skills. Selected women were sponsored for training at Weaving Service Centre, Jaipur, Government of Rajasthan. The fabulous Khadi products were on display at Nature Bazaar, New Delhi, an exhibition organised by Dastkar from 10th to 21st Nov. 2022.



Various organic products were displayed at Dastkar Exhibition like Sarees, Shawls, Shirts, Kurtas for both men and women made from



organic cloth, Rugs, Yoga Mats, door mats etc. All these products were woven by marginalized rural women. This proves the fact that if given opportunities, these women can showcase their untapped talent! Special thanks to the team especially women from the READ Knowledge Centre in Geejgarh having a unit of Geejgarh Mahila Hasta Kargha Samuh, who have contributed for making this exhibition successful.

Role of Social Entrepreneurship and contributions towards women empowerment

AISECT/Rabindranath Tagore University, Bhopal and Indian Council of Social Science Research, New Delhi organised a Seminar on Women Empowerment: Creating, Nurturing and Transforming the Society, on 4-5 November 2022 at the University campus. READ India in partnership with PVR Nest contributed immensely by setting up various skill development and behavioural change communication programmes, empowering the women of the marginalized communities at Garima Grih, a public welfare initiative of PVR NEST, the CSR arm of India's leading film exhibition company, PVR Limited in association with Municipal Corporation of Delhi (MCD).

Garima Grih is a multi-utility safe community centre that empowers women through digital literacy and employment generation programmes. There is a 'Jan Suvidha Kendra (Common Service Centre), 'Mahila Sashaktikaran Kendra (Women Empowerment Centre). PVR Nest has renovated the facilities in association with MCD. READ India partnered with PVR Nest, to make women learn stitching and sewing and digital literacy skills.
