On September 5, 2024, a new library was inaugurated at Panchayat Bhawan in Saijni Nankar village, Saidnagar Rampur block, representing a transformative step for the community. A collaborative effort between READ India, the Saijni Nankar gram panchayat, and local government authorities, the Gyan Kendra serves as a safe and vibrant place for holistic development of the local community.

Equipped with an extensive collection of books, educational materials, and digital resources, the Gyan Kendra caters to all age groups, providing underprivileged residents with enhanced access to education and skill-building opportunities.

The inauguration, attended by over 100 residents, featured the presence of the District Panchayat Raj Officer (DPRO) and the Country Director of READ India. Within its first month, the Gyan Kendra enrolled 40 new members. Local students and women have already reported significant benefits, including improved access to study materials, a quiet learning environment, and increased livelihood prospects through skill development programs.

Enhancing traditional skills of Embroidery at Trilokpur and Tribal Gyan Kendras, Lakhimpur





The initiative centred reviving and training the Tharu tribal embroidery art, "Kasida," to preserve and promote the cultural heritage of the Tharu community. The training program focused on applying this traditional embroidery to both traditional dresses and modern products like bags, pouches, mobile pouches, and laptop bags.



Weaving Training at Tribal Gyan Kendra, Lakhimpur

A weaving training program was held in the remote tribal village of Chedia Purab. It included mobilization efforts, repairing 15 traditional handlooms (Khaddis), and distributing thread. The training emphasized color matching and the creation of products such as Dari, bed runners, puja mats, yoga mats, and table runners.
